

Greenevers Existing Conditions

Greenevers has seen an 11% decrease in population since 2010 (while Duplin County has seen 20% decrease)


Greenevers Economy and Employment

Other Survey Responses



Community concerns include lack of trash removal and internet access, as well as the future of the youth



Respondents had mixed feelings on municipal services, with many wishing for clearer communication and some saying it was too expensive



Respondents saw the future Greenevers having more stores, beautiful houses, a post office, and a continued sense of community

All Greenevers residents will have convenient access to basic amenities such as highspeed internet, grocery stores, ATMs, recreational facilities, and a post office.

In Greenevers, all residents will feel safe and secure.




Pursue the creation of a full-time law enforcement position within the town

Assess the long-term needs of the existing water and sewer systems



Determine feasibility/costs of extending water and sewer systems, and identify potential funding sources

Review and update Greenevers' Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of accessory dwelling units, tiny homes, and other low-cost housing options



Partner with local nonprofit organizations to conduct home repairs and accessibility upgrades to allow seniors to age in place



Identify and pursue state and federal grants (e.g. Community Development Block Grant – Neighborhood Revitalization to support home repair activities)

Greenevers will be a model of small-town community, cooperation, and civic engagement.

Support the formation and continued engagement of public advisory committees




Promote educational opportunities for residents to learn about town processes and how to get involved






Current Land Uses
